MAT Application Process (\$40 Nonrefundable Application Fee)

- Character Questionnaire: Must use forms linked to from the application menu page
- Applicant Admission Statement: Part of online application with a focus on becoming a teacher
- Resume: Written with a focus on becoming a school teacher documenting your experience in teaching
- Conferment of a BA/BS degree from your university
- English Proficiency: TOEFL® iBT score of 80+ or an IELTS™ score of 6.5+ or qualifying interview/writing assessment
- 3.0+ GPA (70+ GPA from your home institution)
- Three Professional References: From leading faculty
- Declaration of Finances: International students must provide proof of adequate funding for their studies and living expenses while in the U.S. George Fox University requires three items as proof: declaration of finances, letter of employment, and a bank statement.
- Copy of Your Passport Identification Page

Undergraduate Scholarships:

George Fox University is committed to recognizing students who excel academically. Student scholarships are based on academic performance and are awarded each year for up to four years of undergraduate study.
